**Comments on General Meeting** – Chuck Roberts’ presentation of Adobe’s Photoshop Elements 7 and Lightroom 2: More enlightenment on the Adobe product line, including the “impressive” ability to create a photo montage.

For April, Paul suggested presenting internet browsers, music players, or mp3 audio format conversion as possible topics; we decided on browsers and will talk about Internet Explorer 8, Mozilla Firefox, Chrome (by Google), and Opera. Among features discussed we will try to cover tabbed browsing in all of the browsers...The April “Learn 30” will have Mel discussing MS Office 2003 Excel; Geof said discussions could include Excel tabs and workbooks...In May we will do our PC clinic while we have the capacious room available at OLLI-Tallwood. For June, Paul suggested Chuck Roberts may demonstrate a Wii console and various games; the Google Online Suite was also suggested... We must continue gaining experience with webinar software, to possibly present a webinar event in July with Gene Barlow and the Acronis True Image software.
